WEAVERS OF THE DAISY CHAIN GANG CHORUS: Ties That Bond

Peter Cramer and Jack Waters invited artists, activists, and advocates of AIDS awareness to participate in the activation of the NYC AIDS Memorial on June 10, 2023. The all day event was a durational performance/ installation in collaboration with NYOBS - the "queer- skinned kitchen band" of which Cramer and Waters are members. Beginning at noon, the ensemble led the weave of a tapestry of ribbons, sound, movement, music, and text throughout the Memorial site, evoking the tradition of springtime maypole celebrations.

The public was invited to bring a photograph, drawing, poem, lightweight momento that acknowledges and commemorates those lost to, or living with, AIDS /HIV. These objects were attached to the "web" of red binding materials including ribbons, cloth, rope, etc.

Life Between Buildings

Jun 2, 2022 – Jan 16, 2023 MoMA PS1


Allied's 8th street archival space functioned as a resource for curator Jody Graf's inclusion of LPV and P.O.O.L., Allied's performance collective of the '80s in this exhibition that explored how artists have engaged the city's interstitial spaces—"vacant" lots, sidewalk cracks, traffic islands, and parks, among others—to consider the politics of public space through an ecological lens.

The exhibition included a panel discussion at MoMA PS1 and the Clemente Center where Peter and Jack presented their history with ABC No Rio culling from the ephemera, images and videos in Allied's collections that dovetail the period of Cramer and Waters' co-directorship of No Rio when Allied functioned as No Rio's sponsoring organization (roughly spanning their 1983 - 1985) when they participated in the implementation of No Rio's independent non-profit status.

Allied/LPV once again joined the 2023 zine community in celebration of the East Village's history of DIY culture past and present.






MAD (Mad Art Days) Paris Art Fair

Performative lecture by Peter Cramer and Jack Waters

Milwaukee Institute Of Art And Design (MIAD) Union Auditorium, Milwaukee, WI September 14, 2023 for the exhibition: Friends, Neighbors & Distant Comrades: Selections from the Moore Collection of '80s NYC Art

In their hybrid approach of piercing boundaries dividing spectacle and discursive intervention, Cramer and Waters engaged elements of moving image, sonic emission, live art, and social engagement by condensing time in an historical perspective collision with the here and now.

The duo was invited by ABC No Rio co-founder Alan Moore to share their take on "indie" work groups and spaces, their experiences with the dance collective Pool, Allied, ABC No Rio, and Petit Versailles Garden that coincided with their ongoing work with the archives of Allied/LPV, ABC No Rio and their own work as queer collectivist agitators from off the beaten path. On arrival, the artists observed Milwaukee's cultural landscape. The immediate surroundings they found themselves in was their lodging at Saint Kate, The Art Hotel, a well appointed and centrally located accommodation that is cited "among the first hotels in the nation to broadly celebrate arts in its many forms." They took in the immediately apparent transition from a declined industrial economy into a cultural tourist economy with nearby arts center, theaters, museums, the impressive collections and considerable projects exhibited in and sponsored by the hotel, and the hosting art institute, where design appeared to continue as a foreground with Moore's exhibition as a contrast of socio-political cultural historical critique. In their accustomed strategy, they incorporated these contexts into the presentation so that NYC's history that they experienced folded into the narrative of the role art and culture play in the ongoing tide of gentrification. While in Milwaukee, Peter, Jack, and Alan visited QZAP, the Queer Zine Archive Project. Experiencing this shared nexus of prior cross associations with Queer activism was a testament to the successes of Cultures Of Resistance and dissent that exist as an ongoing, if often tense, dialogue within the celebratory and joyful interactions of creative intercourse. After several months of research and inspection, archival scholar, Marco Lanier, created a draft Findina AID to 3 of the core boxes in the ABC No Rio subcollection of Allied's archives. Liza Kirwin, the deputy Director of the Smithsonian's Archives of American Art visited Allied's archive space. Then Liza, who retired this year, invited Peter and Jack to visit the Smithsonian Institution in Washington DC. The DC visit in January 2023 was followed by a visit to Allied's archival space by Jacob Proctor, the Smithsonian's Gilbert and Ann Kinney New York Collector. The conversation with Jacob continued the discussion initiated by Liza, on the possible acquisition of portions of Allied's archives by the Archives of American Art. In the interim, Nicholas Martin, curator for the Arts and Humanities Departments, Special Collections at NYU made similar visits to Allied's archive. We are considering the viability of an integration of institutional partnership with grass roots archival strategies harnessed by a relational database as we continue the digitization and cataloging of the ephemera, photographs, video, celluloid, and born digital elements of our broad, diverse, and uniquely intersectional collections being an interim access point at the 8th street site.

Allied's former sponsored projects My Comrade Magazine by Linda Simpson, and Pussy Grazer by Annie Thing and Glennda Orgasm passed from Allied's archives into collections exhibiting the zines at <u>Copy</u> <u>Machine Manifestos: Artists: Who Make Zines</u>, a survey of zine-making practices in North America from the late 60s to present. The Brooklyn Museum exhibition opened on November 17, 2023. Allied's editions of both runs were the only known complete collections in exhibitable condition. Allied/LPV was invited to table at Printed Matter's Sunday Zine Fair in the museum's pavilion on Sunday, November 19th, a special day-long event held on occasion of the exhibition.





On Friday October 13th the VIsual AIDS Symposium, <u>Researching Artists Lost to AIDS</u>, included the life and work of Allied alumna Valerie Caris at the Whitney Museum. The presentation by Julia Harris was researched from Allied's archival sources donated to the Fales Downtown Collection and Visual AIDS.

YOUTH WORKSHOPS

Xavier Acarín Wieland brought his Parsons School of Design class, Designing the Multispecies City, for a visit to LPV led by Peter and Jack. The course contributes to critical thinking and creative practice, inciting students to imagine the city as a space of social and environmental justice. The work from the class resulted in the exhibition, Multiplicities Experiments in Co-habitation, at PS1 Gallery in April and May 2023.

Similar class visits to LPV with a crew of high school students was made on July 24th by The School of the NY Times led by Michaela Farrell on themes around Experimental Theater, Devised Performance, and Neo-Futurism. As well as garden rebuild sessions led by Solar One.

Nevertheless we continue to find refuge in the resources we bring as a community with new friends and collaborators along with the mentors who continue to inspire and guide us along our path. Though we are saddened by the loss of those who leave us, we are heartened by the lessons of strength, endurance, joy, and ecstasy taught by resistance and pleasure and the influences of their living examples. We continue to celebrate our dear Charles Lum in the prolific film output we presented these last years since his departure. We look forward to mounting and exhibiting the works of our queer mentor, Jerry Tartaglia, whose work with Mix NYC (formerly the New York Lesbian and Gay Experimental Film Festival) that he was so instrumental in co-founding. In addition to the humor and brilliance of Jerry's output, we would be at a loss without his essential shaping of the preservation and interpretation of the works by his mentor, the great Jack Smith. Likewise we mourn the loss of our beloved friend, teacher and colleague, Janet Panetta, whose intensely disciplined approach is foundational to the merging of technical prowess in the classical ballet and contemporary dance idioms. That Janet was among the first to arrive, last to leave and center of attention of any party dance floor is not a contradiction to her professional brilliance, but a complimentary asset to such dedication. The loss of the great sound artist and musician, Phil Niblock, will be felt as the absence of an irreplaceable monument. Allied/LPV is proud and fortunate to have hosted these remarkable artists and others in one form or another in the trajectory of our history as presenters of the experimental, radical, and in our own self defined tradition. Look forward to more from these prolific talents in the coming year as we, in our bold and uninhibited fashion, continue to develop and foment the new, as yet unsung, but inevitably profound artists to also leave their mark!

A search for a Creative Assistant is underway.






Allied's most recent board member, **Jane Dowling**, was a member of Post Punk bands Miracle Room and Wisdom Tooth, performed as part of the official Olympic roster of entertainment Barcelona, Spain in 1992, on Second Stage at the Jones Beach Lollapalooza in 1992, and at the Whitney Biennial in 1994. Inspired by Susan Brown, Jane worked with Community Research Initiative in the early days of HIV/AIDS research and then worked with NYU Medical Center's AIDS Clinical Trials Group. While working with the end-of-life anxiety study, Jane trained as a Death Doula and End-of-Life Planner.

Lucia Minervi has stepped down as Board President. She remains an active board member while developing her art practice in Perugia, Italy. Peter Cramer has been appointed as the interim Board Chair. Sur Rodney (Sur) and Susan Brown continue to serve as board members.





LPV LIGHTING UPGRADE

Nicholas Vargelis has updated his lighting design creating a beautiful, modular color wash of the garden with the practical effects of performance and installation enhancement as well as providing safe navigation for nighttime in the garden inspired by the color patterns in Bette Gordon's iconic film Variety as presented at LPV in 2022. Nicholas, with the group Et Al, first created The *Blue Balcony* in 2013 and he subsequently curated a multi-tiered exhibition of Paris based urban architect Yona Friendman in 2018 in association with CNEAI, where he now serves as a Director.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2024

NEW PROGRAMMING PROCESS

A search for a Curator, Tech Director, Hosts, ASL interpreter, and as always, projects will begin with the galvanization of the LPV Programming Committee that has guided event planning for the last 2 years. Proposals will continue to be entertained by sending ideas following the instructions at the call for proposals. There will no longer be a deadline or specific timeframe as the garden events will be shared with neighboring gardens, gardens and outdoor sites throughout the boroughs, and other partnering venues as LPV begins reconstruction renovations and physical site developments.

SITE UPGRADES

Planning of an ambitious renovation was started, including the reconstruction of the longstanding arbor, plots, tables, seating, stage, and a new spatial plan. The revamp will be anchored by NYC Department of Parks with Participatory Budgeting Funds allocated by NYC District 2 City Council. The project will result in permeable paths, new seating and raised flower beds inclusive of improved accessibility. Commencing in 2025, the entire upgrade is anticipated to take about 12 months to complete.

UPCOMING PROJECTS

Allied/LPV will again be included in the Friendly Fire section of the upcoming Printed Matter Art Book Fair April 25-28.
